YOU WILL NEED

YARN AND NEEDLES

Wendy, Nina (19% wool, 72% acrylic, 9% polyester, 100g/12m)
2 balls of Green Eyes (3060)

A pair of 6mm needles
A 30cm diameter polystyrene ring

We just love this yarn! If you're thinking it looks a bit adventurous for you, fear not - there's a how-to video on YouTube – go to <http://bit.ly/sk-100-nina>. You'll get a great effect for scarves too!

Note Nina is constructed in a different way to other yarns. The yarn emerges from a black mesh to form a fringe. The black mesh is used to knit and purl through.

Start knitting here...

Slip 8 mesh loops onto a 6mm needle.

Row 1 Knit each loop, by knitting through the loop on the needle.

Row 2 Purl each loop, by purling through the loop on the needle.

Repeat these 2 rows until the knitting measures 100cm.

Cast off.

MAKING UP

With some DK yarn, wrap the the knitting around the polystyrene ring and sew in place, fastening off any loose ends.

Attach small Christmas decorations with long pins or by sewing them in place. 🍷
