







MATERIALS YOU WILL NEED

□ Toft Alpaca, DK
Baby Alpaca, Steel
(100% baby
alpaca)
1 x 100g/230m ball
□ 4mm needles

☐ Eight buttons

## **TENSION**

Yarn used knits as DK to this tension: 24 sts and 28 rows to measure 4x4in (10x10cm) over stocking stitch using 4mm needles

## **ABBREVIATIONS**

7 ST WRAP insert RH needle between 7th and 8th sts on LH needle, yarn round needle, draw up a long loop, knit this and 1st of the 7 sts together

This lace pattern will work well knitted with variegated yarn as well as plain.



You don't need to make buttonholes as the lace pattern provides holes.

n alpaca scarf – isn't that expensive? It would be, if you knitted a scarf that used lots of balls of yarn, but this design by Kirstie McLeod uses just one. "It's a luxury yarn," Kirstie says, "But you'll find scarves on the high street costing more to buy than this does to make, and they won't be made of British-grown pure alpaca!" ## Start knitting here...

 $\begin{array}{l} \textbf{Cast on } 51 \text{ sts using } 4\text{mm needles.} \\ \textbf{Row 1} \text{ (RS)K1, *K1, yf, K4, sl 1, k2tog,} \\ \text{psso, K4, yf; rep from * to last 2 sts, K2.} \\ \textbf{Row 2 and every alternate row} \text{Purl.} \\ \textbf{Row 3} \text{ K1, *K2, yf, K3, sl 1, k2tog, psso,} \\ \text{K3, yf, K1; rep from * to last 2 sts, K2.} \\ \textbf{Row 5} \text{ K1, *K3, yf, 7 sts wrap, K1, sl 1,} \\ \text{k2tog, psso, K2, yf, K2; rep from * to last 2 sts, K2.} \\ \end{array}$ 

**Row 7** K1, K2tog, K4, yf, \*K1, yf, K4, sl 1, k2tog, psso, K4, yf; rep from \* to last 7 sts, K1, yf, K4, sl 1, K1, psso, K1.

**Row 9** K1, K2tog, K3, yf, K1, \*K2, yf, K3, sl 1, k2tog, psso, K3, yf, K1; rep from \* to last 7 sts, K2, yf, K3, sl 1 K1, psso, K1.

**Row 11** K1, K2tog, K2, yf, K2 \*K3, yf, 7 sts wrap, K1, sl 1, k2tog, psso, K2, yf, K2; rep from \* to last 7 sts, K3, yf, K2, sl 1, K1, psso, K1.

Row 12 Purl.

These 12 rows form pattern. Repeat this 12 row pattern 4 times,

Repeat this 12 row pattern 4 times, ending with a row 12.

**Dec row** K2tog, ssk, \* K7, ssk, K1, k2tog; rep to last 11 sts, K7, ssk, k2tog. [41 sts] **Next row** Purl.

Next row K2, \*yo, K2, sl1, k2tog, psso, K2, yo, K3; rep to last 9 sts, yo, K2, sl1,

k2tog, psso,K2, yo, K2.

Repeat these 4 rows until your knitting meas 62cm, ending with a 2nd purl row. **Dec row** K2, \*yo, ssk, sl1, k2tog, psso, k2tog, yo, K3; rep to last 9 sts, yo, ssk, sl 1, k2tog, psso, k2tog, yo, K2. [33 sts] Starting with a P row, st st 3 rows.

Starting with a Prow, st st 3 rows.

**Next row** K2, \*yo, K1, sl1, k2tog, psso, K1, yo, K3; rep to last 7 sts, yo, K1, sl 1, k2tog, psso, K1, yo, K2.

Repeat these 4 rows until your knitting measures 68cm.

**Dec row** K2, \*yo, sl2, k3tog, p2sso, yo, K3; rep to last 7 sts, yo, sl2, k3tog, p2sso, yo, K2. [25 sts]

Starting with a Prow, st st 3 rows.

Next row K2, \* yf, sl 1, k2tog, psso, yf, K3; rep from \* to last 5 sts, yo, sl1, k2tog, psso, yo, K2.

Repeat these 4 rows until your knitting measures 90cm.

Stocking stitch 6 rows, cast off in st.

Attach the buttons in a row on the stocking stitch rows as shown. Weave in all loose ends.

## STEP-BY-STEP SLIP 1, K2TOG, PSSO



Insert the point of the right-hand needle into the next stitch as if to knit and take it off the left-hand needle.



2 For the next stitch, insert the right-hand needle into the next two stitches on the left-hand needle and knit them together.



Insert the point of the left-hand needle into the slipped stitch on the right-hand needle and take this stitch back over the k2tog.



Take the slipped stitch off the right-hand needle and drop it off the left-hand needle. The slipped stitch will slope towards the left.
