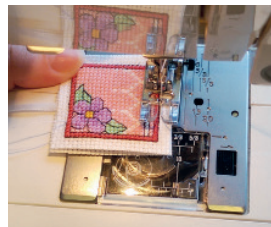

How to...

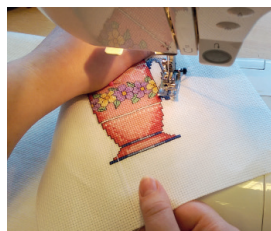
Make your 3D bookmarks



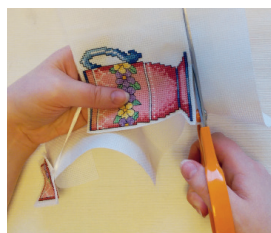
1 To make a teabag, trim two square designs, leaving a three-square border. With wrong sides facing, align squares. Sandwich 12cm (4½in) of ribbon between them, centrally along bottom edge. Pin and sew around all four sides. Fray edges.



2 Lay your mug facing upwards onto a piece of felt, slightly larger than the design. Insert the ribbon end of your teabag tag between your stitched piece and your felt backing. Align it centrally along the top edge of the mug. Pin in place.



3 Carefully sew around the outside of your stitching, getting as close to the stitching as you can. You may want to use a free-motion foot on your machine if you have one.



4 Trim around the outside of your mug, cutting one square away from your stitched border, and cutting through both layers (aida and felt). Take care not to snip through your ribbon as you cut.



5 Lastly, sew around the inside of your mug handle, trying to get as close to the stitching as possible. Using sharp embroidery scissors or a craft knife, make a small cut, then insert fabric scissors and carefully cut out the inside of the handle.
