MOVE YOUR COLOURED BAUBLES
AROUND UNTIL YOU'RE HAPPY WITH THE LAYOUT

## NOTES

Seam allowances are $1 / 4 i$ in, unless otherwise noted.

- Press seams to one side throughout,
unless otherwise instructed.
WOF = width of fabric.
RST = right sides together.
CST = Corner-square Triangle
- Press fabrics well before cutting - Pattern assumes WOF is at least 42in - Print fabrics supplied by Andover Fabrics (andoverfabrics.com) Quilted by Annie Seaboch (search for Annie Leigh's Sew Happy on Facebook for more details).
FABRICS USED
- All print fabrics used are from the Holiday collection by Alison Glass for Andover Fabrics. Kacka Cotton Solids fabrics are both Kona Cotton Solids by Robert Kaufman: Insignia and Honeysuckle.

■Twenty (20) 13 /4in squares (G).

CUTTING OUT
1 From the background fabric cut: - Fifty (50) lin $\times 31 / 2$ in pieces (A). One hundred (100) ${ }^{23 / 4 \mathrm{in}}$ squares (B).
Two hundred (200) $13 / 4 \mathrm{in}$ squares (C). Two hundred (200) $13 / 4$ in squares (C). Thirty two (32) lin $\times 2^{1 / 4}$ in pieces (K). Thirty two (32) $21 / 4$ in squares (L).
Thirty two (32) 31/4in squares (M). - Forty (40) $81 / 2 \mathrm{in}$ squares. Eight (8) $11 / 2 i n \times$ WOF strips.

From each of Fabric B and 2 Fabric C cut:
Ten (10) 2in $\times 51 / 2$ in pieces (D).

- Ten (10) $13 / 4 \mathrm{in} \times 81 /$ in pieces (E).
Twenty (20) $13 / 4 \mathrm{in} \times 3$ in pieces ( F ).

marked line and trim, leaving a $1 / 4 / 4 \mathrm{in}$ seam allowance. Press the corner triangle away fom the main piece to finish (Fig 1). PIECING THE ROUND BAUBLES 1 Join a background C CST to the 4 bottom corners of an aqua $F$ piece Make a total of four of these. Then join n aqua G piece to either side of two of the units (Fig 2).

5 Join two coral and pink cross stitch H pieces together as a four-patch. Then sew a shorter unit from step 14 to either side of the unit. Press, then join the longer units to the top and bottom to complete a star unit (Fig 3).

Sew an aqua $D$ piece to either side of Othe star unit, then join an aqua E piece ot the top and bottom to make a round bauble unit (Fig 4). Add an A piece either side of a grey I piece to form the top unit. Join this to the top edge of the round bauble unit (Fig 5).

17 Add a background B CST to all four corners of the unit to complete a round twenty five of these blocks as follows: Five Fabric C baubles with Fabric I and $G$ centres
Five Fabric B baubles with Fabric $J$ and $K$ centres.
Five Fabric D baubles with Fabric E and $L$ centres.
Five Fabric $F$ baubles with Fabric E and $L$ centres.
Five Fabric E baubles with Fabric D and $J$ centres.
PIECING THE SMALL BAUBLES
Join a K piece to the left and right sides of a grey $N$ piece to make bauble top (Fig 7). Make a total of xteen bauble tops.

9 Add an L CST to the top corners of an O piece. Add an M CST to the bottom corners (Fig 8). Repeat on all remaining $O$ pieces.


70 Join the bauble tops to the top of each pieced $O$ unit. Then sew a $J$ pauble block (Fig 9). Make a total of
ber sixteen small bauble blocks, using all of the O pieces.
ASSEMBLING THE OUILT TOP
21 Sew five round bauble blocks and four 21 background $81 / 2$ in squares into a row, alternating the blocks and squares. Make a total of five rows.
27 Join five background $81 / 2$ in squares $2 L$ and four small bauble blocks into a ng the blocks and squares. Make a total of four rows.

73 Sew the rows together, alternating round bauble and small bauble rows. Sew the background fabric $1 / 1 / 2$ in $\times$ WOF strips together along the short ends to make one long strip. Trim to two $11 /$ in $x$ 2/2in strips and two $11 / 2$ in $\times 74 / 2$ in strips. onger strip to strips to the bottom complete the quilt top.

## OUILTING AND FINSHING

Cut the backing fabric in half across
24 cut the backing fabric in half across Che width. Remove the selvedges and seam. Press the seat togethe

75 Press the quilt top and backing well. Make a quilt sandwich by placing the backing fabric right side down, the batting on top, then place the quilt top centrally and right side up. Baste the layers together using your preferred method.

26 Quilt as desired. Annie (Annie Leigh's Osew Happy) quilted an intricate, retro star pattern using a longarm machine. Trim off the excess batting and backing fabric and square up the quilt.

27 Sew the binding strips together 27 end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open and trim the dog ears. Fold in half lengthways, wrong side together, and press.
20 Sew the binding to the right side 20 of the quilt, creating a neat mitre at each corner. Fold the binding over to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place around the edge to finish.

Four (4) 2in $\times 31 / 2 i$ in pieces (E).
Two (2) $11 / 2$ in $\times 121 / 2$ in pieces ( $F$ ).
Two (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ in $\times 141 / 4 i$ in pieces (G).
- One (1) 20 in square for the lining.

2 From Fabric A cut:

- Eight (8) 2in squares (H).

Two (2) $11 / 2 \mathrm{in} \times 161 / 2$ in pieces (K).

PRACTISE PIECING CORNERSQUARE TRIANGLES WITH THIS CUSHION DESIGN!

From the cushion back fabric cut: - Two (2) 13 in $\times 181 / 2$ in pieces.

7 From the binding fabric cut: $7_{=\text {Three (3) } 21 / 4 i n \times \text { WOF strips. }}^{\text {From the }}$ PIECING THE CUSHION FRONT O Join a B piece to the right of a $J$ piece. OThen sew a C piece to the bottom of the unit (Fig 1). Add an H CST to the top right and bottom left corners. Add an A CST to the top left hand corner, then add an N CST on top of that corner (Fig 2). Make a total of four J units.

Q Add an N CST to the bottom corners of an E piece (Fig 3). Make four. Add a D Make four. Join the I units to the top of the E units (Fig 4).

10 Join the pieced $J$ units either side of 10 an E unit to form the star points (Fig 5). Make two. Join an I unit either side of the $M$ piece to form the centre. Sew the three sections together to form the star block.
11 Sew an $F$ piece either side of the
cushion front, then add a $G$ piece to the top and bottom. Join an O piece to either bottom Add a K piece either side, the oin $L$ piece to the top and bottom to complete the cushion front.

## OULLTING AND FINISHING

17 Press the cushion top and lining well.
1 Make a quilt sandwich by placing the lining fabric right side down, the batting
on top, then place the cushion front
centrally and right side up. Baste the layers together using your preferred method.

13 Quilt as desired. Annie (Annie Leigh's Sew Happy) quilted an intricate, retro star pattern using a longarm machine. Trim off the excess batting and lining fabric and square up the cushion front.
$14^{\text {Take the pieces of cushion back fabric }}$ 4 and press under by $1 / 2$ in twice on one of the long edges. Press to secure. Pin and then topstitch in place to hem.

15 Place your cushion top right side down. JPlace the two backing pieces on top right sides up, aligning the raw edges, with the hemmed edges overlapping in the centre. Pin, then baste around the outer edges. 16 the short edges, then press in half, WST. Use the binding strip to bind around the outer edge, as you would a quilt.
